- Use the web URL address only for sources that might be difficult to find or if required by your professor, and enclose the address in angle brackets <a href="http://www.etc>following">http://www.etc>following</a> the date you accessed the material.

## **WORKS CITED**

Alphabetize sources by the author's last name, followed by the complete first name and initials (if any). If there is no author, editor, or translator's name, use the first significant word in the title (omit words such as "The" and "An"). Do not use separate categories for books, periodicals, etc.

**Double space** all entries.

If you include the web address, enclose it in angle brackets <a href="http://letc">http://letc</a> preceded by the date you accessed the site. For example,

Clinton, William. Address to the Nation by the President. Web. 8 Aug. 2008.

<a href="http://www.state.gov/www/regions/africa/strike\_clinton980820a.html">http://www.state.gov/www/regions/africa/strike\_clinton980820a.html</a>.

Page numbers should not be included unless the electronic source provides them. Your printer will number pages differently from other printers. If the source provides a total or range of page numbers, include those in your works cited. If paragraph numbers are provided by the source, include them in the citation with the abbreviation "par." or "pars." in place of page numbers. For example,

Newsweek (15 June 1997): 3 pp.

Postmodern Culture 8.1 (1997): 28 pars.

For scholarly journals, use the volume and issue number plus the year of publication. For magazines and newspapers, use only the complete date of publication with the month abbreviated (27 Dec. 2008).

NOTE: The first line of all works cited is flush with the left margin and all consecutive lines are indented one tab stop (five spaces). In MS Word, type Control+T at the beginning of a citation to create hanging indents on your Works Cited page. For example,
